Many parishes operate St. Vincent de Paul ministries, bringing volunteer aid to neighbors in need.

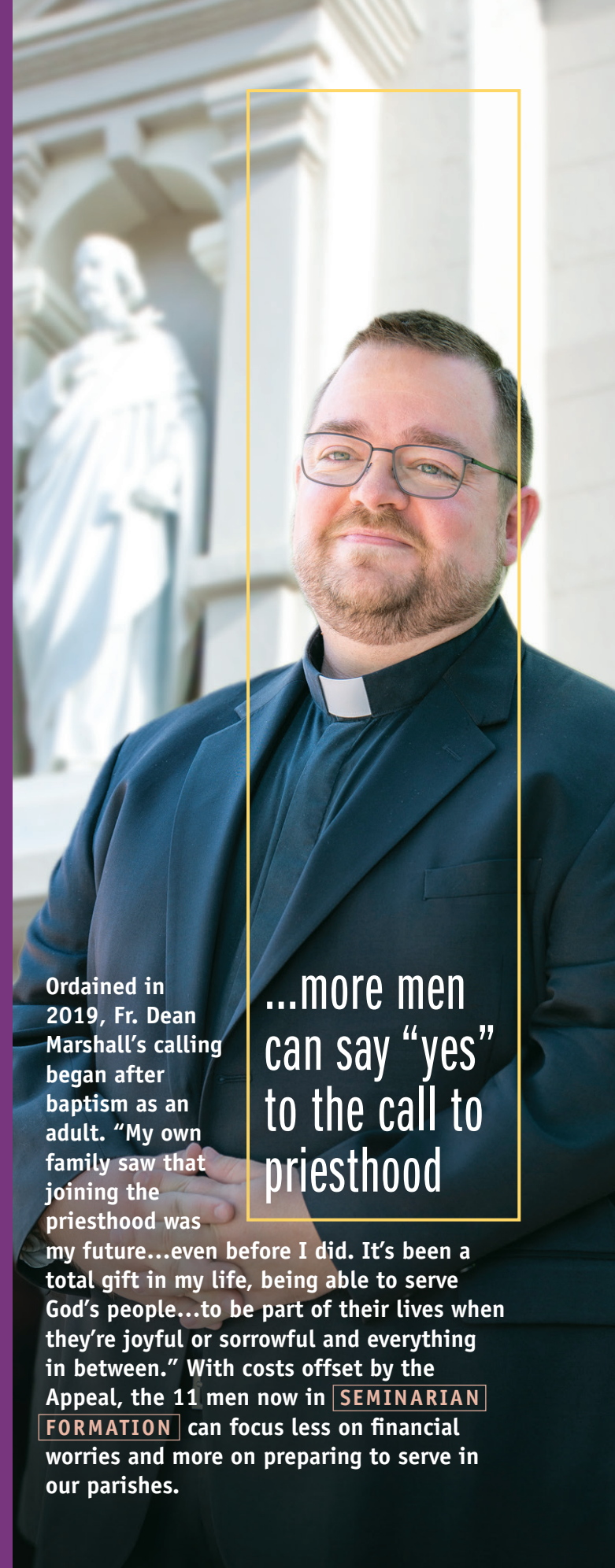
